Abstrac The formulation of the norms of space law in matters of atmospheric contamination, has had its own characteristics in form and content, which are not generally found in other branches of international law. The way in which these rules have crystallized, reflect in themselves, a normative revolution that has not been sufficiently evaluated. In other words, the regulations on environmental space arise as a result of a global need that manifests itself in a multilateral process derived from resolutions of the UN General Assembly, international conventions and reports of space agencies. In the normative frame of space law there are norms of jus cogens or peremptory norms applicable to the subjects and have a different nature in its origin as an international customary law, for which it can be affirmed that they are distinguished from other rules arising from similar multilateral processes in other branches of international law.
